Hello Director Arriola,

The latest response from CTI seems like we're back to meeting #2 or #3 where they are removing the entire C wing. Again, this wing is made up of 20 classrooms - at least half of them are specialized classrooms and labs that are not easily shared with other teachers. As I was crafting this, Mr. Ho sends an updated email with Additive 1" Building C Construction with 2026 appropriation and Additive 2 with FFE with 2027 appropriation.

What if "base bid" stays intact as originally defined (all the wings, etc.) and Additive 1 & 2 be the special scope items outside of the base bid. Lester reminded us a few meetings ago about "base bid" items and special scope items such as auditorium, multi-purpose field, Photovoltaic cells, etc. I am sure we can identify \$16 million special scope items instead of just identifying C-wing as the first choice.

In summary, keep base bid items for the \$143 and do the special scope items for Additives 1 and 2.

- 2. Temporary Classrooms
 - Per the meeting with Bob Fenton, he shared that he's able to front \$200 million.
- 3. Procurement Reform
 - Worked with Rikki Orsini on Bill 143. The bill was introduced by Senator Ada.
- 4. The budget hearing for DPW is scheduled for this Thursday, June 19.
 - DPW will work with DOA to request a pay plan assessment for engineers, construction workers, technical workers, and school bus drivers.
 - DPW will email Ed Birn and cc Clynt.
- 5. Hagatna Pool
 - A groundbreaking event is coming soon; DPW would like to invite swim teams.
 - Pool construction is expected to be finished within a year.

 - Vince reported that construction is progressing. No issues yet.
 - GWA informed DPW that they do not yet have an adequate water supply to provide, but are looking to share with UOG temporarily.
- 7. DPHSS Mangilao Building
 - The new contractor wants to demolish the building for redevelopment.
 - Initial renovation is \$58 million.

A. CALL TO ORDER

a. Meeting was called to order at 9:03 AM by DPW Director Vince Arriola.

B. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- Finalize Final Construction Costs: Discussion on number of required classrooms in C-Wing.
 - a. Cedric Cruz (TRMA) clarified that there are 96 classrooms in the RFP document. 29 classrooms in Wing A (Ground Level) inclusive of one classroom at the gym. There are 28 classrooms in Wing B (Ground Floor) inclusive of 4 classrooms at the end of the wing. There are 39 classrooms total on the Second Level, 14 classrooms at B-Wing, 21 classrooms at A-Wing, and 4 classrooms above the Administration Building.
 - b. Ho Eun (CTI) indicated that TRMA/SSHS and CTI are counting the classrooms differently, 96 classrooms minus the 4 classrooms in the Credit Recovery Building takes the number of classrooms to 92 while student population stated in the RFP is for 2,000 students. CTI asked if classroom sizes can be reduced but not change the quantity. It appears that a student body of 20 per classroom is needed instead of 28 students per classroom.
 - c. Carla Masnayon (SSHS) clarified that the GCC classrooms are required to meet a standard size for labs and automotive shops that SSHS would need to meet for certification. Deleting C-Wing (17 classrooms) will bring the total number of classrooms to 79.

2. Discussion on Overall Cost

a. Ho Eun (CTI) explained when the bid was submitted there was no developer's fee included and among all bidders CTI is both the Construction Contractor and Developer. CTI believes they are the most economical contractor based on track record, CTI is doing 40% of the construction here on Guam. Typically, CTI takes out a 7% ± developer's fee.



b. Vince Arriola (DPW) mentioned that at this point DPW will sit down with GDOE/SSHS and confirm the non-negotiables.

C. NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Insurance and Financing Negotiations-(DOA/GEDA/BBMR)
 - a. Vince Arriola (DPW) mentioned that it is CTI's responsibility to provide insurance coverage as the landlord for the facility that DPW will be leasing. Ho Eun (CTI) asked if typhoon insurance will be required if typhoon shutters are provided. CTI indicated that typhoon insurance is expensive. DPW is expecting insurance for typhoon water leakage, exterior lights, air conditioning units, and baseball, track & field lights.
 - b. Lester Carlson (BBMR) indicated that the budget, based on \$132M construction cost, would allow for debt service to \$11.7M or approximately \$12M. The budget is \$16.3M, leaving \$4.3M for insurance, maintenance, and operations.

- 1. DPW and SSHS to finalize the number of classrooms and construction budget and get back to CTI tomorrow, August 13, 2025.

A. CALL TO ORDER

• Meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by BBMR Director.

B. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- 1. Discussion on project funding and financing.
 - a. Lester Carlson (BBMR) clarified that the fund to build the school is \$143M, less the \$9M for FF&E, and less \$1.6M for the contribution to the arts. This is the basis of the \$132M for construction. The Guam Legislature passed an amendment yesterday to take \$16M from excess FY25 revenue, which is currently \$33M. Lester Carlson (BBMR) said this money can only be used for procurement of special scope items but not for the base bid items.
 - b. Lester Carlson (BBMR) clarified that the \$132M includes a developer's fee. The cost of bond issuance is \$5M and that \$5M is broken down and includes a developer fee of \$4,320,000. Fee is based on historical fees for developers that were requested.
 - c. Vince Arriola (DPW) asked whether the \$16M per year in capitalized interest could be applied to construction. Lester Carlson (BBMR) confirmed that the \$16M cannot be added to the base bid construction amount of \$132M; but may be applied to the additive scope items such as the auditorium building. Lester Carlson (BBMR) reiterated that all base bid items must be constructed with the \$132M allocated.
 - d. Cedric Cruz (TRMA) presented a cost estimate accounting additional costs increases due to elapsed time and the design did not incorporate the base bid items and special scope items. The estimate anticipated modification, specifically the C-Wing Section, to be able to award the contract as a design bid build project. CTI's square-foot cost per building is about \$2 less than the TRMA's estimate.
 - e. Cedric Cruz (TRMA) noted that removing the C-Wing Section would reduce classrooms and there is a potential opportunity to incorporate the GCC programs back into the A-Wing and B-Wing sections. The project would still accommodate 2,000 students without the C-Wing. The primary impact would be teachers sharing classroom.



- f. Carla Masnayon (SSHS) emphasized one of the non-negotiable items for SSHS is one teacher per classroom. Currently, SSHS shares classrooms with JFK and teachers must bring their equipment and belongings home after each session. SSHS has agreed to forgo proposed storage rooms in the classrooms.
- g. Joe Duenas (SSFM) asked Cedric Cruz (TRMA) if the \$132M construction budget (excluding FF&E) for base-bid items is achievable, noting that moving to the second bidder would not resolve a budget inadequacy, since the budget is based on market price. Cedric Cruz (TRMA) confirmed that the government estimate base bid was escalated up to \$158M. The number of classrooms count was based on one classroom per teacher, rather than accommodating 2,000 students; which typically is not costeffective for the project.
- h. Lester Carlson (BBMR) suggested that the team write CTI a letter stating the \$143M budget, which includes FF&E and Arts and that \$132M is for the base bid items. The letter should determine if CTI will be able to do project with these given parameters.

We cannot certify funds for any \$16 M appropriations in FY 2025 and FY 2026 without legislation supporting that additional funding, the current budget bill will be vetoed with the BPT being reduced to 4.5% so we need to stick to the Par Amount of \$166 M and not consider anything outside of the authorized financing.

As a follow up to our meeting, I am not sure that the gap proposal laid out in the numbers we reviewed works from a practical standpoint, although funding costs from the amounts appropriated in the SSHS bill can be used in the pre-development phase under the SSHS bill. However, because there is little chance of getting the appropriation in place prior to our financing, there would be a sizable gap in the financing amount needed. Therefore, I do not think it would be practical to get the financing done from a marketing perspective unless the developer could agree to a reasonable funding commitment based on the scenarios presented by the Government.

We cannot certify funds for any \$16 M appropriations in FY 2025 and FY 2026 without legislation supporting that additional funding, the current budget bill will be vetoed with the BPT being reduced to 4.5% so we need to stick to the Par Amount of \$166 M and not consider anything outside of the authorized financing.

As a follow up to our meeting, I am not sure that the gap proposal laid out in the numbers we reviewed works from a practical standpoint, although funding costs from the amounts appropriated in the SSHS bill can be used in the pre-development phase under the SSHS bill. However, because there is little chance of getting the appropriation in place prior to our financing, there would be a sizable gap in the financing amount needed. Therefore, I do not think it would be practical to get the financing done from a marketing perspective unless the developer could agree to a reasonable funding commitment based on the scenarios presented by the Government.

A. CALL TO ORDER

- Meeting was called to order at 1:13 pm by DPW Director, Vince Arriola.
- Lester Carlson (BBMR) introduced Aulii Taitano and Maragret Backstrom from Morgan Stanley. BBMR has requested Morgan Stanley to prepare a cost comparison of the project financing relative to CTI's proposal with Barclays. Morgan Stanley shared a summary of their findings to the Team.

B. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- 1. Finalize Construction Negotiation Discussion on CTI's Response Letter
 - Lester Carlson (BBMR) raised concerns on CTI's Response Letter. CTI's proposal included two funding sources: one source is the bond proceeds, and the other is government appropriation of \$16.4M per year, for 2 years. CTI did not use the \$166M cap for bond, but \$156M for the cap. CTI also proposed two and half years (913 days) of capitalized interest (Cap-I) which deviates from the RFP requirement of two years (730 days).
 - Lester Carlson (BBMR) explained that the government lacks funds to cover Cap-I under Municipal Finance, thus, this cost is incorporated into the borrowing costs. Cap-I is intended to use during the construction period only and not for an extended time.
 - Lester Carlson (BBMR) stated that the government cannot sign a construction contract exceeding \$143M due to insufficient funds, and BBMR would be unable to certify funding availability. CTI's proposal to rely on the \$16.4M per year in government appropriation during construction is a non-starter for Gov Guam. The Team discussed CTI's history of protests and litigation, and the possibility of the current negotiations fail. Members stressed the importance of "dotting all i's and crossing all t's," and agreed that GovGuam's position would be protected by maintaining thorough documentation, including letters and meeting minutes.
 - Lester Carlson (BBMR) highlighted concerns with CTI's proposed financing structure: (i) extending capitalized interest to 2.5 years instead of the 2 years required under the RFP; (ii) reliance on two "stacks of money" bond proceeds and legislative appropriations not yet appropriated; and (iii) reallocating first-year O&M



- and insurance funds into construction. These deviations were viewed as financially and legally unacceptable.
- Joe Duenas (SSFM) mentioned that CTI's proposal may be accepted from a legal and procurement standpoint long as: (1) The contract expressly caps Gov Guam maximum liability at \$166,365,000; (2) any supplemental funds for FY2026 and FY2027 are recognized as "subject to" legislative appropriation; and (3) the \$1.56M shortfall for the Arts is confirmed in writing as CTI's sole responsibility. With these safeguards, DPW would have legal protection and maintain compliance with the Ma Kåhat Act and the RFP. CTI's Letter complies with these three (3) criteria. While SSFM's review indicated CTI's proposal could be accepted with safeguards (cap at \$166M, FY2026–2027 appropriations subject to legislature, and CTI assuming shortfalls).
- Lester Carlson (BBMR) acknowledged SSFM's concerns and reminded the Team to adhere to the prior agreement, where there will be no additional funds added to the base bid scope to avoid a protest from the other bidders and award the project to the bidder that can build the base bid scope within the \$143M budget. SSFM noted that the \$143M base figure is outdated, as it was derived from 2022 estimates, assumed a smaller student population of 1,700 (compared to the current 2,000), and was based on a Design-Bid-Build procurement approach rather than the present Design-Build model. These changes reasonably increase the baseline cost. While Lester Carlson (BBMR) acknowledged this point and agreed it could justify requests for additional funding, he emphasized that any such funds should be applied only to special scope items (e.g., auditorium, solar, credit recovery building) and not to the base bid.
- Carla Masnayon (SSHS) expressed her concerned if CTI reduces their proposal to meet the \$143M budget, they may compromise quality. She emphasized that SSHS wants the school built correctly from the start, without early maintenance issues.
- Lester Carlson (BBMR) emphasized that relying on unappropriated legislative funding was not prudent fiscal policy. Accordingly, while SSFM recognized the proposal legally sufficiency, the Team concurred in the decision not to accept it.

C. NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Discussion on Financing
 - Aulii Taitano (Morgan Stanley) presented a cost comparison to CTI's (Barclays)
 financing proposal and explained that Morgan Stanley could assist in issuing bonds
 under the legislation financing provision. The Ma Kåhat Act does not authorize Gov
 Guam to be the issuer of the bond so GEDA would likely have to use a national
 issuer, who would typically charge a fee.
 - Joe Duenas (SSFM) asked about the impact on financing of a potential Federal Reserve interest rates cut in September. Morgan Stanley representatives explained that the numbers would be minimal because they are maximizing the PAR amount. A lower interest rate reduces the overall bond amount and increase funds available for O&M, and it slightly decrease the amount of capitalized interest. Overall, does not have a significant impact on the project.
 - Aulii Taitano (Morgan Stanley) pointed out some discrepancies in Barclay's proposal. Barclays proposal is not maxing out the bond PAR amount, assuming \$156M in bonds



- and \$32M in cash from government appropriations. Barclays is also extending the amortization and extending the Cap-I period another 6 months.
- Lester Carlson (BBMR) indicated that Government of Guam has used various financing and underwriters such as Bank of America for past projects (for GPA, GWA, Port, GMH) and that Barclays has not prevailed on previous deals.

2. Discussion on Moving to Bidder 2

- Joe Duenas (SSFM) mentioned if the government cannot sign the contract with CTI, then the Committee would have to move down to Bidder #2.
- Lester Carlson (BBMR) mentioned that during Bidder #2's presentation their construction cost was a lot less than Bidder #1. In addition, there are less proposed classrooms, 87 compared to the original 96 classrooms.
- Carla Masnayon (SSHS) indicated her preference to move to the next Bidder if SSHS will not receive the full construction and functionality. SSHS should still receive some of the additives or special scope items such as lightings, baseball and softball field and maybe the Auditorium Building. It was noted that Bidder #2's presentation reflected approximately 87 classrooms compared to the original 96, raising concerns of reduced capacity and program loss. SSHS administration emphasized that reductions in classrooms or academic programs would be unacceptable, even if Bidder #2's costs appear lower. At the same time, members expressed concern that CTI, if pushed to meet \$143M, could compromise quality by excessive value engineering.
- Vince Arriola (DPW) reminded that Bidder #2 mentioned during their presentation cost might be different than what is in their proposal. DPW has not opened Bidder #2's proposal to confirm the cost and reminded the selection and grading of bidders was based on the most qualified and not pricing. The Team discussed the \$143M ceiling is realistic under current market conditions, citing estimates of \$476 per square foot. It was agreed that cost feasibility must be confirmed to ensure any bidder can realistically deliver the full program within available funding.
- Joe Duenas (SSFM) asked if the government could increase the construction cost number from \$143M closer to \$166M through other government funding sources or appropriations. Lester Carlson (BBMR) responded "No" and that the \$166M is a PAR amount of the finances. The net in the bond is \$143M. BBMR is not concerned about the potential protest or lawsuit from CTI if the Team move to Bidder #2.
- The Team emphasized that all negotiations meeting minutes, letters, and communications are being preserved to ensure transparency, fairness, and compliance with procurement law. This record will provide strong protection for GovGuam in the event of a protest.

SSHS AI Legal Analysis of Core Tech Proposal 08/21/25

Legal and Procurement Analysis - Simon Sanchez High School Project

1. The Ma Kåhat Act of 2013 (as reenacted in 2023)

The Act establishes the framework for financing, procurement, and construction of the new Simon Sanchez High School. It authorizes the Guam Department of Education, through the Department of Public Works, to solicit a single contract covering financing, construction, furniture, fixtures, equipment (FF&E), insurance, and maintenance.

- The Act sets a statutory financing cap of \$166,365,000 in principle under §58D108. This ceiling applies specifically to the financing instruments issued (bonds, loans, or alternative financing).
- The Act authorizes leaseback payments to be made from "lawfully available monies" under §58D109, which includes legislative appropriations, so long as such appropriations are lawfully enacted and available annually.
- The Act requires the contractor to assume responsibility for all construction, FF&E, insurance, and maintenance during the leaseback period, and mandates that the project adhere to the approved GDOE design and all applicable codes.

Implication: The law prohibits exceeding the \$166.365M financing cap, but does not prohibit supplemental appropriations to support the project. Appropriations may be used in addition to financing, provided the bond or loan principal itself does not exceed the statutory limit.

2. The RFP Requirements

The RFP was issued pursuant to the Act and reflects its requirements. It calls for an integrated contract that includes financing, construction, FF&E, insurance, and maintenance.

- The RFP incorporated the statutory funding ceiling, meaning proposals must remain within the \$166M authority for financing.
- It required full scope delivery of the school design, including 87 classrooms, all wings, and the necessary FF&E.
- It made clear that total project cost had to align with statutory authority and available appropriations.

Implication: The RFP sets the government's expectation that the awarded contract be consistent with the Ma Kåhat Act's financial limitations. However, like the Act, it does not expressly prohibit the use of supplemental appropriations as long as the financing principal remains within the statutory cap.

3. Core Tech International Final Proposal (August 22, 2025)

Core Tech submitted its final proposal to DPW confirming compliance with project scope and requirements.

- Proposal Amount: \$167,660,000 (including \$1.66M for Arts in Public Buildings).
- Financing Structure: 30-year bond financing netting approximately \$133.3M, plus FY2026 and FY2027 appropriations totaling \$32.8M. This produces \$166.1M available for the project.
- Shortfall: Approximately \$1.56M remains, which Core Tech has committed to absorb.
- Core Tech acknowledges the \$166M statutory cap and structures its financing to stay within that limit, using appropriations as supplemental funding.

Implication: While the headline proposal amount exceeds \$166M, the government's exposure is capped at \$166.1M, with Core Tech absorbing the balance. The financing principal remains within the statutory ceiling. This structure is consistent with the Ma Kåhat Act and the intent of the RFP, provided the supplemental appropriations are enacted by the Legislature.

Conclusion

The Ma Kåhat Act and the RFP require that financing not exceed \$166,365,000 in principal. Core Tech's proposal complies with this requirement by keeping the financing principal below the cap and using appropriations to supplement available funds. The proposal also meets the full scope requirements for construction, FF&E, and the mandated art allocation.

From a legal and procurement standpoint, the proposal may be accepted so long as:

- 1. The contract expressly caps the Government of Guam's maximum liability at \$166,365,000.
- 2. Any supplemental funds (FY2026 and FY2027 appropriations) are recognized as subject to legislative appropriation.
- 3. The \$1.56M shortfall is confirmed in writing as the responsibility of Core Tech, not the government.

By structuring the contract to reflect these safeguards, DPW will have legal cover against challenges and will be able to move forward with Core Tech while maintaining compliance with the Act and the RFP.

Proposed Contract Clause - Financial Cap and Appropriations

Section X. Financial Limitation and Supplemental Appropriations

1. Maximum Government Liability.

The Parties acknowledge that pursuant to §58D108 of the Ma Kåhat Act of 2013, as

amended, the principal amount of financing authorized for the New Simon Sanchez High School project shall not exceed One Hundred Sixty-Six Million Three Hundred Sixty-Five Thousand Dollars (\$166,365,000). Under no circumstance shall the Government of Guam be obligated to pay or assume liability in excess of this statutory financing limit.

2. Supplemental Appropriations.

The Contractor acknowledges that a portion of project funding is anticipated from annual appropriations of the Guam Legislature for Fiscal Years 2026 and 2027. The obligation of the Government to make such payments shall be subject to the lawful enactment of appropriations by the Legislature. In the event such appropriations are not enacted, the Government shall have no liability beyond the statutory financing limit stated in Paragraph 1.

3. Contractor Absorption of Shortfall.

The Contractor agrees that any project costs in excess of the combined financing proceeds and lawfully appropriated funds, including but not limited to the estimated One Million Five Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$1,560,000) shortfall, shall be the sole responsibility of the Contractor. Such costs shall not be borne by the Government of Guam under any circumstances.

4. Conformance with Law.

The Parties agree that this Section is intended to ensure full compliance with the Ma Kåhat Act of 2013, as amended, and the terms of the solicitation. In the event of any conflict between the terms of this Contract and applicable law, the provisions of law shall control.

- Project Fund: The project fund deposit of \$171.1 million assumes a \$37.8 million appropriation from Fiscal years 2026 and 2027, which is not guaranteed to be available
- Capitalized Interest: Assumes 2.5 years of capitalized interest through February 1, 2028, vs. assumption of 2 years through October 1, 2027
- Final Maturity: Assumed 32-year final maturity as well as 32 years of appropriations vs. standard 30-year assumption
- Costs of Issuance: Total costs of issuance assumed at 1.5% of par, which does not cover assumed developer fees or all anticipated other costs

I. CALL TO ORDER

• Meeting was called to order at 3:14 p.m. by Vince Arriola.

II. UNFINSISHED BUSINESS

- 1. Finalize Construction Negotiation
 - Vince Arriola (DPW) addressed and recapped the letter he wrote on August 15, 2025, per the letter, the facility must take care of the students, the design, the inclusion of C Wing, FF&E, and the total cost of construction cannot exceed \$143M. This is the government's position. GEDA would provide the funds issuance for financing and total cost of construction and specified services cannot exceed \$143M due to the funding limits. If \$16M more a year is appropriated into the law for this year and/or next year, at this time, the government's position is \$143M, as there are unknown factors and these are potential appropriations. This is what the government can certify in a contract today. If the total exceeds \$143M, further funding depends on the legislature providing \$16M either this year or next. If approved, the funding should cover special scope items. The Budget Bill for the additional \$16 million remains unpassed and unsigned. Vince Arriola (DPW) asked Eun Ho (CTI) if he could meet the requirements as stated in his letter dated August 15, 2025.
 - Eun Ho (CTI) requested clarification, based on what he believed was the Legislature's current intent to appropriate an additional \$16.3M for construction in the next year.
 - Lester Carlson (BBMR) mentioned that securing the \$16M for Fiscal Year 2026 might not be possible due to Business Privilege Tax (BPT) reduction and other spending factors from the legislature. He said an additional \$16M for year two (Fiscal Year 2027) might be very slim. He emphasized that the government cannot certify the funds available for the project at this time. He further stated that if there is an additional appropriation by law, that can be dealt with separately in the future for additional scope items.
 - Eun Ho (CTI) proposed getting a basic contract plus a change order, subject to the passage of the budget bill and the SSHS appropriation and asked if this was



acceptable. Lester Carlson (BBMR) reiterated that a change order would have to be for additional scope items. Vince Arriola (DPW) affirmed 30 years at \$143M. Eun Ho (CTI) stated he didn't know if CTI could do this. Vince Arriola (DPW) reemphasized that if there are additional \$16M appropriations in '26 and '27 this would be available only for special scope items like the auditorium.

- Eun Ho (CTI) asked if the government could wait until they have better information on the status of the FY '26 budget. Lester Carlson (BBMR) clarified that even if there were an additional appropriation, it would not matter, because current negotiations are centered whether CTI can deliver the base bid for \$143M and the additional appropriation would be for special scope items.
- Vince Arriola (DPW) asked if Ho Eun (CTI) could deliver all required base scope for \$143M, Ho Eun (CTI) expressed concern that he was being asked to answer this today. Vince Arriola (DPW) reminded him that this has been discussed in the last two meetings and was also included in his letter to CTI. Eun Ho (CTI) said he understands the government position. Vince Arriola (DPW) stated that we could pause to see what the Legislature does. Eun Ho (CTI) agreed that this would be fair. Lester Calrson (BBMR) stated that if CTI can't decide today, the Legislature is anticipated to vote tomorrow. Lester Carlson (BBMR) went on to state that the Legislature actions on the budget won't alter the government's request for CTI construction cost to be done at \$143M. Any additional funding, if appropriated, must be used for additional scope items not currently included in negotiations. He also stressed that the impact of the Legislature's rollback of the Business Privilege Tax will make future appropriations slim.
- The discussion closed with the government agreeing to give Eun Ho (CTI) an additional week to see if he could meet the government requirements of \$143M.

Core Tech International Corporation (CTI) is pleased to submit this final proposal in response to your letter dated August 15, 2025, outlining the Government of Guam's requirements for the New Simon Sanchez High School project.

We fully acknowledge and understand the following project requirements:

- The facility must accommodate 2,000 students.
- The design must include 87 classrooms.
- All wings, including C Wing, must be constructed without omission.
- Construction must encompass all Furniture, Fixtures, and Equipment (FF&E).
- The total project cost, including FF&E and the 1% allocation for Arts in Public Buildings and Facilities under Public Law 20-27, may not exceed \$143 million.

We understand the \$143 million is subject to \$166 million bond principal cap. Splitting the funding sources into two — bond financing for 30 years and direct payment for two years during construction — will yield higher project funding while maintaining the \$166 million cap.

More specifically, based on the discussion with the underwriter Barclays, 30 years of financing may yield \$133.3 net to the project (construction, FF&E, and arts), subject to assumptions believed to be reasonable but not guaranteed. It will be augmented by two appropriations in FYs 2026 and 2027 of a combined \$32.8M (which CTI believes to be permissible under the public law), thereby totaling **\$166.1M**.

1. 30 years of bond

a. Bond Paramount \$156.2M
b. Capitalized Interest - \$20.6M
c. Issuance Fee - \$2.3M

2. FY26 & FY27

a. Appropriation \$32.8M

3. Total the above: \$166.1M

After thorough review and consideration to meet the above top four bullet requirements, CTI respectfully submits the following final proposal:

Construction and FF&E: \$166,000,000

• Arts in Public Buildings and Facilities (1%): \$1,660,000

• Total Proposal Amount: \$167,660,000

Based on the financial stacking mentioned above, the available funding for the project is \$166.1M, yet the required amount is \$167,660,000, resulting in a shortage of \$1,560,000. However, CTI is committed to meeting the budget.

CTI remains fully committed to delivering this project within budget and on schedule. We look forward to continuing our partnership with the Government of Guam to fulfill its critical educational infrastructure goals and to serve the Simon Sanchez High School community.

I. CALL TO ORDER

• Meeting was called to order at 3:02 PM by DPW Director, Vince Arriola

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Term Sheet-Review & Discuss

- The group discussed the CTI Term Sheet to gain a clearer understanding of the cost breakdown from CTI's perspective.
- HE (CTI) discussed the insurance policy and assured the government that CTI will utilize its own company's insurance policy to provide typhoon coverage, as most external insurance providers currently do not currently offer typhoon protection in Guam.
- VA (DPW) asked HE (CTI) about the Proposer's financing vs. GEDA-led financing. HE (CTI) expressed the belief that the Ma Kåhat Act required the Proposer (CTI) to bring their own financing to the table and they were prepared to do so. VA (DPW) stated that GEDA's enable legislation may require them to facilitate the financing and that he would like further into this.
- JD (SSFM) asked HE (CTI) if the Government provided its own financing, if Core Tech would be okay with this. HE (CTI) expressed some reservation about this but affirmed that it would be acceptable.

B. Public Law and RFP Requirements

- i. Project Cost Cannot exceed \$166M Price Ceiling (Construction, Financing, and FF&E)
 - CTI discussed the possibility of removing the construction cap of \$166M via the Guam Legislature, as the legally allowable monthly financing costs could allow them to build the current school (more school) as envisioned by the original design.
 - HE (CTI) stated that if the Legislature removes the \$166 million construction cost ceiling, CTI is prepared to include all current design elements while maintaining the existing annual lease payment.
 - Concerns were discussed about potential legal protest from other bidders if the cap is amended; CTI believes it's not an issue due to their unique compliance and proposal.



- Additional concerns discussed included what if the Legislature does not pass the law.
- HE (CTI) said that he would provide a plan in writing to build the school within the parameters of the current law and provide it in writing to the DPW this Monday, allowing DPW to assess the features.
- ii. RFP Requirement (2,000 students)
 - JD (SSFM) asked CTI if 1) They can build a school for 2,000 students, that we would all be proud off, within the guidelines of the funding guidelines (\$166M) of the law which included construction and financing costs.
 - HE (CTI) stated that they could build a school within the cap that would sufficiently accommodate 2,000 students
 - HE (CTI) stated that if the language of \$166M is kept, then some construction elements would need be compromised. He gave examples such as returning proposed classroom sizes back to standard (following DoDEA specifications) classroom sizes, adjusting hallway widths and ceiling height, etc.

III. OPEN DISCUSSION

- HE (CTI) assured CTI will self-fund and begin the project immediately, deferring going to bond market for financing until the building permit is secured.
- HE (CTI) stated his believed that GEDA cannot issue bonds for the project without further legislative action, and doing so could cause legal and financial issues under the existing RFP and applicable law. He also noted that this would impact the government debt ceiling.

IV. NEXT STEPS

- CTI will submit the construction plan with a value engineering breakdown in writing along with its financing plan.
- CTI to include relevant laws referenced during the meeting regarding potential contract modifications to support the committee in the event the matter is brought before the Legislature.
- VA (DPW) will provide key discussion points during this meeting and bring to the SSHS Negotiation Committee and legal counsel for further review and discussion.

A. CALL TO ORDER

- Meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m. by DPW Director, Vince Arriola.
- Attendees introduced themselves.

B. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- 1. Public Law and RFP Requirements
 - a. \$166M Price Ceiling (Construction, Financing, and FF&E)
 - The group noted that changes to the law via the Legislature could trigger protests, project delays, and lead to other unfavorable outcomes to the project.
 - ES (GDOE) stated that introducing further legislation to increase the cap of the school was not desirable at this stage of the procurement process. He also acknowledged that adjustments would have to be made to the original design to meet the budgetary requirements of the current law.
 - b. RFP Requirement (2,000 students)
 - JD (SSFM) mentioned that the documents provided by Core Tech in Negotiation Meeting #1 with DPW and GDOE indicated that the current design can accommodate approximately 2,800 students.

C. NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Update on Negotiation Meeting #1 w/ Core Tech DPW/GDOE
 - VA (DPW) gave a recap of Negotiation Meeting #1 with DPW, GDOE and CTI. CTI expressed the option for the government to revise the language in the law that caps the project at \$166M Price Ceiling. The issue being that the annual debt service amount in the law will allow them to build the school as designed, but the price ceiling of \$166M does not. This is due to interest rates.
 - o To meet the current requirement of \$166M, CTI indicated that they would have to adjust the design, which might include things like sizes of classrooms, hallway widths, and ceilings heights to help reduce costs. Things such as the auditorium, which were additives, would also need to be removed.
 - o MM (TRMA) emphasized the importance of additional classroom space to support improved organization and storage for teachers. He also noted that not all



- classrooms will be limited to the minimum number of students, and some will require additional space to accommodate instructional needs.
- For Financing, VA (DPW) mentioned that CTI brought up the Ma Kåhat Act. According to their review of the law, GEDA is not able to issue a bond. TG (GEDA) commented on the financing, stating CTI might use their own, but they might not receive Guam tax credit incentives.

2. Four DRAFT Contracts Status

- SSFM has submitted four draft contracts to Attorney Terry Brooks for review. The Insurance & Maintenance contract included feedback from the Simon Sanchez HS Administrators. Once his review is complete, the draft will be circulated to the committee for additional feedback.
- SSFM is targeting sending the revised DRAFT contracts to Attorney Terry Brooks by close of business Wednesday, July 16th. JD (SSFM) noted that Assistant AGs Tom Keeler and GDOE Attorney, Fred Nishihara, are copied in emails on contracts and the AG's Office will be included in reviews. The four draft contracts follow:
 - a. Lease Agreement (P3 Umbrella Agreement)
 - b. Project Development Agreement (Construction)
 - c. Insurance & Maintenance Agreement
 - d. Ground Lease

A. CALL TO ORDER

B. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- 1. Public Law and RFP Requirements
 - a. \$166M Price Ceiling (Construction, Financing, and FF&E)
 - i. Lester (BBMR) outlined the initial funding approach with a par amount of \$166,365,000. This figure serves as the price ceiling for the overall project financing.
 - ii. After accounting for a premium, the total project fund was estimated to be approximately \$169M. This total includes all necessary components for the project.
 - iii. The \$166M ceiling encompasses costs related to construction, financing, and furniture, fixtures, and equipment (FF&E). The discussions emphasized the importance of balancing these sources and uses within the established budget.
 - iv. For the estimated costs, the goal is to ensure that all expenses related to construction and FF&E remain within the price ceiling to avoid budget overruns.

b. RFP Requirement (2,000 students)

- i. To make sure that the RFP aligns with the requirements set forth in the Ma Kahat Act, which indicates that the \$166M must be inclusive of construction, financing costs, and FF&E (Furniture, Fixtures, and Equipment).
- ii. The RFP requires proposers to indicate their ability to comply with the Ma Kahat Act; any interpretation that suggests the \$166M only covers construction costs is considered inconsistent with the law.
- iii. The RFP needs to explicitly state how the project will be financed and what the net construction cost will be after accounting for various deductions (capitalized interest, costs of issuance, etc.). This understanding is essential for both the proposers and the government entities involved.
- iv. Reducing classroom size may be unacceptable due to the need for storage for teachers, pointing out that existing classrooms are already cramped. They proposed exploring design elements that could cut costs while still providing adequate space for equipment.
- v. Financial obligations tied to the DOE and capital reserves, outlining project priorities with classrooms and sports facilities as the top focus, followed by the auditorium and landscaping. It was noted that adjustments may be necessary based on discussions with CTI regarding value engineering proposals, aimed at identifying cost reduction strategies while ensuring adequate space for equipment.



- vi. The RFP process may require ongoing discussions and adjustments based on feedback and interpretations from all stakeholders involved.
- vii. Bond counsel opinions were referenced to support their interpretations of the RFP and the law, reinforcing the need for compliance and clarity in the documentation provided to proposers.

2. Four DRAFT Contracts Status

- a. Lease Agreement (P3 Umbrella Agreement)
 - i. The lease agreement will involve a lease-back arrangement where CTI will manage the construction and lease the completed school back to the government.
 - ii. The lease must include provisions for financing, construction, FF&E, insurance, and maintenance to ensure comprehensive coverage of project costs.
 - iii. Define routine maintenance versus capital maintenance in the lease to avoid confusion over responsibilities.
 - iv. Adequate insurance provisions must be included to protect against potential risks, with emphasis on ensuring the insurance amount covers all necessary aspects.
 - v. The lease should incorporate a cure period for addressing any defaults to provide a framework for resolving issues without immediate termination (Includes all contracts)

b. Project Development Agreement (Construction)

- i. The Project Development Agreement (PDA) is essential for defining the roles of both parties, ensuring clarity in the construction and lease-back process.
- ii. Orrick will draft the primary documents, with collaboration from both parties' legal teams.
- iii. The PDA will outline that CTI will manage demolition and construction before leasing the completed school back to the government.
- iv. The PDA should cover financing terms, including stipulations for insurance, maintenance, and capital funding.

c. Insurance & Maintenance Agreement

- i. The insurance and maintenance provisions will be incorporated into the lease-back agreement to ensure coverage for potential risks.
- ii. Discussions highlighted the need for adequate insurance coverage to protect against costs associated with maintenance and repairs.
- iii. A capital maintenance fund will be established to ensure funds are available for larger repairs and routine upkeep of the school.
- iv. The insurance coverage and costs will be reviewed annually to ensure they meet the necessary requirements.

d. Ground Lease

- i. The ground lease should clearly specify all financial obligations, including any payments due and how they will be structured over time.
- ii. Adequate insurance coverage must be stipulated to protect against potential risks.

C. NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Ownership of Contracts
 - a. The ownership of contracts related to the project should be clearly defined, particularly regarding who holds rights to the design and construction agreements.
 - b. The contracts will likely be included in the lease agreement, outlining responsibilities and ownership rights.



- c. Both parties' legal teams will review the contracts to ensure compliance with the law and clarity on ownership stakes.
- d. Ownership of contracts may impact financing arrangements, especially in terms of liability and risk-sharing.

D. NEXT STEPS

- 1. Prepare for the upcoming meeting with CTI, ensuring clarity on the construction cost position of \$143M, inclusive of financing and FF&E.
- 2. Finalize details regarding the allocation of the \$16M for construction and maintenance, confirming if it is available and how it will be appropriated.
- 3. Clarify and confirm the interpretation of the Ma Kahat Act in relation to the \$166M ceiling in discussions with legal counsel.
- 4. Develop a strategy for negotiating with CTI, emphasizing adherence to the law and the need for clarity on costs.

I. CALL TO ORDER

• Meeting began at 9:05 AM by DPW Director Vince Arriola.

II. DISCUSSION ITEMS

- Public Law 37-22 Overview: The base bid for the project includes \$119M for Phase 1 (new campus and facilities) and \$15M for Phase 2 (sports fields and fencing), totaling \$134M, with an additional \$9M for FF&E.
- Funding Structure: Lester Carlson (BBMR) reviewed the funding structure, noting a par amount of \$166.365 million, with a premium bringing total available funds to approximately \$169 million. He emphasized the importance of balancing sources and uses to ensure sufficient coverage for construction, FF&E, insurance, and O&M.
- Interest Rates: Lester (BBMR) noted a borrowing interest rate of 5.6%, while Eun Ho (CTI) pointed out current market rates at around 6% to 6.2%, emphasizing that these estimates are for planning purposes and subject to change.
- Debt Service and Budgeting: Debt service is approximately \$11M, with an annual appropriation caps set at \$16.3M to allow for insurance and maintenance cost.
- Design Considerations: Eun Ho (CTI) raised concerns about the existing design, suggesting potential modifications or starting over, but Lester (BBMR) noted public law mandates the use of the existing design work.
- Construction Costs: Lester (BBMR) confirmed total construction costs at \$132.9M. Cedric Cruz (TRMA) explained that this estimate accounts for anticipated cost increases due to pandemic-related supply chain issues. He noted that the figure covers the base bid scope (classroom buildings and sports facilities), while additional facilities such as the auditorium, credit recovery classrooms, and certain site improvements remain outside the estimate.
- Insurance Considerations: Eun Ho (CTI) mentioned the high costs associated with typhoon insurance and suggested that they may need to evaluate coverage options despite having typhoon shutters.



- Student Capacity Calculation: Eun Ho (CTI) inquired about the projected capacity for 2,000 students, which Dr. Swanson (GDOE) clarified was based solely on the number of general classrooms.
- Design Flexibility: Eun Ho (CTI) emphasized the need for flexibility in design to meet budget constraints, suggesting scaling down the auditorium. Dr. Swanson (GDOE) suggested that while an auditorium is necessary, it could be scaled down, and they discussed the need for flexibility in design to meet budget constraints.
- Current Market Costs: Eun Ho (CTI) expressed concerns regarding high construction costs, citing recent estimates of \$2,500 per square foot for projects. He stressed the need to manage costs effectively while adhering to programmatic design requirements set by TRMA.
- Collaboration Moving Forward: Eun Ho (CTI) proposed a follow-up meeting to discuss design flexibility and student capacity requirements, emphasizing collaboration with architects and school representatives.
- Design Change Expectations: Vince (DPW) sought clarification on the extent of potential design changes, particularly regarding alterations to the original footprint of the project, emphasizing the importance of maintaining the school's presence and aesthetic appeal.
- Perspective on Flexibility: Eun Ho (CTI) expressed willingness to restart design work if necessary, acknowledging the shift from the earlier \$250M concept to the current \$130M budget. Despite challenges, CTI expressed optimism about finding workable solutions.
- Public Perception and Design Integrity: Vince (DPW) noted concerns about community expectations regarding deviations from the architectural design already shared with students and the public.
- Next Steps for Collaboration: A follow-up meeting was scheduled for the following Friday to assess design changes within the programmatic document, for careful collaboration with TRMA, the principal, and the DOE team.
- Focus on Key Areas for Reduction: Lester (BBMR) identified the credit recovery facility as a
 potential area for cost reduction, cautioning that some proposed changes may not be feasible.

• Meeting was called to order at 10:00 a.m. by DPW Director, Vince Arriola.

B. NEW BUSINESS

- 1. Update on GDOE Core Tech Value Engineering Meeting last week.
 - a. (GLG) SSFM provided the summary update from last week's meeting with Core Tech.
 - Mentioned that there are a few key people currently off island and were unable to attend last week and this week's meeting.
 - Discussion last week was to pull out Wing C temporarily from the project to save about \$16M. C-Wing is where the ROTC and GCC Technical programs are located. CM (SSHS) explained that the ROTC and GCC programs are needed to be part of the new school and therefore it cannot be removed from the project.

2. RFP Programming Document Requirements

- a. Discussion on RFP Programming Documents.
 - Core Tech's Value Engineering items and discussion indicated that they were looking at 101 classrooms and in the programming RFP document the Team was looking at 95 classrooms. CC (TRMA) Core Tech's VE cost proposal accounts for 107 classrooms and should rectify their cost proposal to account for the correct number of classrooms.
 - Number of classrooms is based on student population. SSHS is anticipating 1,700 student population in the new school. Currently, SSHS has about 1450 students and 80 teachers. CM (SSHS) confirms that the current plan has 92 classrooms.
 - JD (SSFM) mentioned that the main objective of today's meeting is to define how the Team could bring down the construction cost to \$132.9M and follow the RFP programming document requirements. Encourages GDOE and SSHS to review Core Tech's VE items and identify what is acceptable and what are nonnegotiable. Reminded the Team that (HE) Core Tech represented in previous meeting that CTI can build the entire school if the \$166M cap is removed.
 - CM (SSHS) indicated that SSHS is not prepared for the project scope reduction mentioned in Core Tech's Value Engineering. SSHS was under the assumption that



Value Engineering means keeping the functionality of the room, but the design might be different and cost effective.

- CC (TRMA) mentioned that the goal is to get a contract to keep the project moving and added that a reasonable approach is to identify what items are necessary because there is opportunity for classrooms to accommodate the 2000 student population via classroom sharing.
- VA (DPW) agrees with SSFM that the Team needs to come up with a list of non-negotiable items and get a contract executed to comply with procurement.
- Meeting was recessed at 11:00 am and resumed at 14:00.
- It was confirmed that TRMA and SSHS will provide a list of non-negotiable items and also identify which items on Core Tech's value engineering is acceptable.

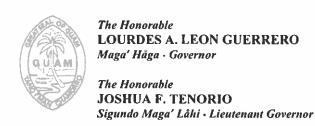

Executive Summary

This report provides an informational analysis of the Simon Sanchez High School budget in relation to recent U.S. high school benchmarks and Guam institutional building costs. The purpose is to highlight cost escalation trends, program-specific uplifts, and market feedback, and to note potential risks should negotiations move from the current proposer to the next ranked team.

The current base bid of 285,000 SF with a construction and FF&E budget of \$143M equates to ~\$502/SF (or ~\$463/SF excluding FF&E). While this appears low compared to mainland benchmarks, the figure does not remain competitive once escalation to a 2026 midpoint and uplift for high school program requirements are considered. With these factors, Sanchez is projected to exceed \$530/SF, consistent with national high school benchmarks (\$550–\$650/SF) and Guam institutional projects (\$480–\$900/SF).

Contractor market input supports this. A federally capable contractor reported a recent building at \$450/SF including FF&E but excluding design, but acknowledged high schools typically require a 25–30% uplift, which brings costs into the same \$530+/SF range as our escalation analysis. A smaller contractor cited \$350–\$400/SF, but those numbers reflect straightforward facilities and do not account for the overhead, compliance, or execution requirements of a large institutional project.

This context underscores our concern: the proposers under consideration are large, federally capable contractors whose cost structures reflect escalation and compliance-driven overhead. Therefore, whether negotiations continue with the current proposer or move to the next ranked team, the same budget feasibility challenge is likely to arise. This report is intended to inform decision-making and emphasize that the \$143M framework may not realistically deliver a fully compliant high school project without adjustment or scope modification.

High School Cost Uplift

A key driver in understanding why high schools cost more per square foot than generic office or classroom buildings is the **programmatic uplift** inherent in secondary school facilities. While a typical office or classroom building in Guam may be delivered in the \$450–\$475/SF range, a comprehensive high school carries an additional 20–35% uplift due to specialized spaces, larger spans, and site-intensive amenities.

The primary contributors to this uplift include:

- Science Laboratories and CTE Shops Enhanced MEP systems, fume hoods, ventilation, and specialty equipment increase cost well above standard classrooms.
- Auditoriums and Performing Arts Spaces Large-span structures, seating, acoustic treatments, and stage rigging add significant per-SF premiums.
- **Gymnasium, Lockers, and Athletic Support** Structural spans, HVAC, and wet areas (showers, changing rooms) drive higher unit costs.
- Cafeteria and Commercial Kitchen Food service equipment, grease traps, and code requirements are costlier than standard classrooms.
- Athletic Fields and Site Infrastructure Drainage, turf, courts, and outdoor lighting require major site investments not present in office/classroom projects.
- IT, Security, and Circulation High schools demand more robust technology, security, and larger circulation areas to support student populations.

When these elements are factored in, the cost per square foot of a high school typically escalates from a baseline \$450–\$475/SF to \$540–\$640/SF, depending on the program intensity. For example, auditoriums and robust CTE programs can push a campus to the higher end of that range, while leaner programs with fewer specialty areas sit toward the lower end.

In the case of Simon Sanchez High School, the current estimate of ~\$502/SF (construction + FF&E) suggests a budget closer to a generic classroom/office building than a fully programmed high school. Once escalation to a 2026 midpoint and the appropriate high school uplift are applied, the cost aligns with the \$530+/SF range observed in U.S. and Guam benchmarks.

Price Escalation Analysis – Simon Sanchez High School

The current construction and FF&E budget for Simon Sanchez High School is \$143M, based on a January 2023 estimate with a midpoint of construction in 2025 (three-year construction duration).



Because project procurement has shifted, the midpoint of construction is now assumed to be 2026. Applying Guam-appropriate escalation factors (+5–6% for 2026, consistent with U.S. forecasts of ~4% plus Guam's historical 1–2% premium for freight/labor), the adjusted project cost is:
• \$150.2M - \$151.6M (≈\$527–532/SF), up from the original \$143M (≈\$502/SF).

This represents an increase of \$7–9M total, or roughly \$25–30 per square foot, attributable solely to one additional year of inflation.

Notes / Exclusions:

- This escalation analysis covers construction and FF&E only.
- It does not include costs associated with shifting from DBB to DB procurement, such as final design costs.
- It also does not include Department of Public Health requirements for bathroom and shower counts for 1,700–2,000 students, which could add further cost.

Contractor Market Feedback

As part of the escalation review, discussions were held with two contractors to cross-check our current unit cost assumptions for Simon Sanchez High School. Both provided feedback on recent projects they delivered and offered perspectives on how those costs compare to a high school program. Their insights help validate the escalation analysis and highlight the importance of recognizing the programmatic uplift unique to secondary schools.

Contractor No. 1 (mid-size, active in DoD work) reported delivering a recent building at approximately \$450/SF including FF&E but excluding design. Initially, they questioned whether \$500/SF for Sanchez was high; however, they acknowledged that high schools typically carry a 25–30% uplift over generic buildings due to program elements such as science labs, CTE shops, gymnasiums, auditoriums, cafeterias, and site infrastructure. Once this uplift is applied to their own experience, their numbers align closely with our current estimate of \$500–530/SF, indicating that the Sanchez budget is in line with realistic market pricing.

Contractor No. 2 (smaller, local) indicated costs in the \$350–\$400/SF range for straightforward construction, not inclusive of design or FF&E. While this suggests that some contractors might deliver lower headline unit costs, such firms typically do not carry the overhead required for large institutional or federally regulated projects. They lack capacity for compliance with federal mandates such as CMMC cybersecurity, certified payroll systems, and the QA/QC processes needed for complex multifacility campuses. As such, while they might be competitive on smaller projects, their ability to manage and execute a project of Sanchez's scale is limited.

In summary, when tied back to the escalation review, the market feedback indicates that the proposers we are likely to see (CTI and other ranked teams) fall much closer to Contractor No. 1 than Contractor No. 2. These firms carry the overhead and compliance requirements necessary for a GovGuam P3 of this scale, and their effective pricing—once uplift and escalation are factored in—lands in the \$530+/SF range. This reinforces that while smaller firms may claim lower numbers, Sanchez cannot realistically be delivered at those levels, and the project budget must reflect the escalated, high-school-specific costs borne by qualified proposers.

Closing Summary



Simon Sanchez High School's current \$143M budget, equating to \$502/SF (2023 base), does not remain competitive once escalation to a 2026 midpoint and high school program requirements are accounted for. The realistic cost is expected to rise into the \$530+/SF range, which aligns with both U.S. benchmarks and recent Guam institutional projects.

While smaller contractors may suggest costs in the \$350–\$400/SF range, those figures do not reflect the overhead, compliance, or systems required to deliver a GovGuam P3 of this magnitude. The proposers under consideration are larger, federally capable contractors whose cost structures include these requirements. As such, even if negotiations were to move from the current proposer to the next ranked team, the underlying budget pressures would remain the same.

This analysis is provided for informational purposes to highlight the risk that simply moving to another proposer may not resolve the pricing challenge. Without adjusting the budget upward or reducing scope, the project faces a significant likelihood of exceeding the authorized funding level. Recognizing this risk now is critical to setting realistic expectations as procurement decisions move forward.

CALL TO ORDER

• Meeting was called to order at 2:12 p.m. by DPW Director Vince Arriola.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Debrief on SSHS Negotiation Meeting #5 with CTI

- Vince Arriola (DPW) recapped the letters that he sent to Ho Eun (CTI) and emphasized today's meeting would require CTI to provide a definitive yes or no to the outlined requirements. He stated that in the prior meeting, CTI was given clear instructions to stay within the \$143M cap, not relying on the \$16M appropriations for Fiscal Year (FY) 2026, maintain program size for 2,000 students, retain the C-Wing, and deliver a complete package inclusive of FF&E. He further noted that any appropriation beyond the \$143M amount may fall outside the government's capacity or authorization to commit. It was reiterated that the Government of Guam cannot guarantee to additional appropriations during construction. Should CTI proceed under the assumption of future legislative appropriations, that risk would rest solely with CTI.
- Tina Garcia (GEDA) clarified that while the Ma Kåhat Act caps total financing at \$166M, it does not establish a construction cap. Vince Arriola (DPW) agreed that he does not see a cap, either a minimum or a maximum of construction in the law. However, Lester Carlson (BBMR) maintained that \$143M must be treated as the ceiling inclusive of FF&E and specialty program spaces.
- Vince Arriola (DPW) emphasized today's meeting with CTI will focus on whether they will commit to the outlined items and defer the financing and RFP compliance issues for GEDA and legal counsel.

B. Project Financing Parameters- (BBMR/GEDA)

• Lester Carlson (BBMR) reiterated on his concern of CTI's financing plan using future appropriation and capitalized interest, which violates the RFP's 730-day completion requirement. He explained that CTI's iteration reduced the bond par amount to \$156M, extended capitalized interest to 2.5 years (~916 days), and attempted to divert O&M/insurance reserves and future legislative appropriations into



construction. He stated these maneuvers were inconsistent with the RFP and created a shortfall of upfront cash. He also raised concerns regarding the \$143M cap and whether it included FF&E (Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment).

C. Construction Cost Analysis- (SSFM/TRMA)

- Ed Hipolito (SSFM) presented an analysis of SSHS construction costs compared to national and Guam construction cost:
 - O He emphasized that the \$143M budget appears low, as high schools generally cost about 25% more than generic facilities due to specialized programs, regulatory requirements, and items such as FF&E. Based on the January 2023 estimate, the project equates to approximately \$502 per square foot for a 285,000 square foot building. With a 2026 midpoint of construction, that number would escalate to about \$530 per square foot.
 - O He noted that the average rate for recent schools is \$550-650 per square foot, not including design fees. Local Guam buildings range from \$480 to \$900 per square foot, with specialized facilities on the higher end. At \$502/sf, SSHS is positioned at the bottom of the market range, creating risk that scope may not align with available funds.
 - He cautioned that high schools typically cost 20–30% more than generic facilities because of specialty spaces (CTE labs, gyms, arts, etc.). He recommended that the project not be delayed further, as annual escalation will increase the risk of overruns.
 - Lester Carlson (BBMR) noted that the analysis demonstrated SSHS sits at the low end of cost benchmarks but should remain feasible, providing some assurance that the budget is not unattainable. Ed Hipolito clarified that SSHS sits the low end of true market pricing but does not fully reflect the higher costs typically associated with high school facilities of this size and complexity.
 - o See attachment for PPT slides.

D. Government Position/ Alignment

- The group acknowledged CTI's August 22nd letter, noting that CTI agreed to bullets 1-4 of the DPW Director's August 15th letter, but not the fifth bullet concerning the \$143M cap.
- Joseph Duenas (SSFM) emphasized that CTI must confirm whether they can deliver the full project within the parameters defined in the DPW Director's letter. If CTI cannot confirm compliance, he suggested that the SSHS Evaluation Committee under Dr. Swanson reconvene to determine whether to proceed with CTI or move to the next ranked proposer.
- No final action was made; the group will wait until the meeting with CTI for further action.

Context – Simon Sanchez High School

What do High Schools cost throughout the USA? What do buildings cost in Guam?

- Current budget: \$143M (~\$502/SF) based on Jan 2023 / midpoint 2025.
- With escalation to midpoint 2026 + high school uplift: \$530+/SF.
- Comparable U.S. high schools (2021+): \$550-\$650/SF avg (up to \$1140/sf high end)
- Guam institutional buildings: \$480-\$900/SF. (DoD over \$1000/SF)
- SSHS budget is on the lower end of the spectrum based on National and Guam averages.

- Labs, CTE shops

Guam-Based Contractor Market Feedback

Contractor No. 1 (mid-size, DoD capable):

- \$450/SF with FF&E (no design).
- With +25–30% uplift = \$530+/SF.

Contractor No. 2 (small, local):

- •\$350–400/SF baseline (no Design), but lacks sophisticated systems (Safety, QC, payroll, QA/QC).
- Qualified proposers (CTI, CAPFA) are in Contractor No. 1 range at min. They carry the Overhead necessary to execute large complex projects.

Risk / Decision Point

- Escalation: One-year delay adds +\$7–9M (~\$25–30/SF).
- CTI & CAPFA: Both carry the same compliance and systems overhead → same cost issue.
- Budget Position: The current \$143M budget is at the low end of true market pricing but does not fully reflect the higher costs typically associated with high school facilities of this size and complexity.
- Consideration: If the project proceeds with Proposer No. 2 under the same budget constraints, the same cost pressures are likely to arise.

 - Ho Eun (CTI) distributed copies of CTI's Letter Dated August 29, 2025. The Letter confirms that CTI is committed to complete the project within the specified scope subject to 2+30 payments of the financing. CTI's letter did not confirm the fifth bullet point of DPW's Letter on August 15, 2025. See copy of CTI's Letter dated August 29, 2025.
 - Lester Carlson (BBMR) acknowledged CTI agreement with DPW Director's letter from August 15th with everything except the fifth bullet, "The total cost for construction; FF&E; and Public Law 20-27, Chapter 8, Title 1, of the Guam Code Annotated, related to Arts in Public Buildings and Facilities may not exceed \$143M."
 - Ho Eun (CTI) stated that construction cost should not be the government's concern if
 the lease and financing terms do not to exceed 8.5% and 2+30 year are respected. He
 stated that the \$143M cap is not binding since it is not in the RFP and argued that
 prior school projects (e.g., JFK, Northern schools) contemplated 32 years of
 payments, which they view as precedent.
 - Vince Arriola (DPW) noted that the construction cost remains at \$143M, as this reflects the funds currently available.
 - Lester Carlson (BBMR) reiterated that the interest rate will affect the repayment, it is possible to get a \$143M deposit, but the real issue is whether it is legally committable since Mr. Ho is willing to do all these (4 proposed bullets from DPW Director's August 15th letter) items, but does not want to be tied into the projected \$143M cap. This is a government problem because the contract cannot be signed off on the money that the government does not have.
 - Edward Birn (DOA) stated that no progress has been made and reviewed the RFP, stating that financing and construction must be completed within two years and the lease cannot exceed 30 years, but the proposal from CTI does not match the RFP. He mentioned the concern of the developer's 2 years of construction plus 30 years of



lease, effectively 32 years, but the RFP only talks about 30 years max. He wanted to refer to the legal team for clarification.

- Tina Garcia (GEDA) confirmed that the lease payment does not start until Year 3, so it is 2 years construction plus 30 years lease. Ho Eun (CTI) agreed with the statement.
- Ho Eun (CTI) asked the committee how past projects financing plan worked. Lester Carlson (BBMR) answered the government have only signed 30-year leases, not 32-year, and the current setup guarantees \$143M for construction. Years 31 and 32 have not been approved yet. If the group agreed on the amount now, the government will be signing a contract on money that is not there.
- Ho Eun (CTI) stated that if future funding does not come through, the risk would fall on bond investors. He proposed structuring the contract into a base project with two additive components contingent upon future funding, committing CTI to deliver the additional scope, if funding become available. This approach places the associated risk on CTI. Ho Eun also added that he will put collateral equipment as part of the additives and will deliver and affirmed CTI is committed to 100% all the scope items on time even if funding is not available.
- Vince Arriola (DPW) and Lester Carlson (BBMR) summarized the three major unresolved issues and those should be referred to legal counsel for consultation:
 - Construction cost capped at \$143M.
 - o Whether the contract can legally extend to 32 years
 - Handling of the extra appropriation from FY 2026 and FY 2027 if those funding are available.

As noted in our most recent meeting between Core Tech International and the Government of Guam, the Department of Public Works and the Guam Department of Education agreed to seek legal guidance before proceeding. Following review, and in accordance with the Makahat Act (5 GCA Ch. 58D) and the requirements of the Request for Proposal (Project No. 730-5-1059 L YIG, as amended by Addendum 1), we are writing to confirm acceptance of your proposal, subject to the following conditions:

- I. Subject to Appropriation: Your proposal and the Government's acceptance are expressly subject to annual legislative appropriations, as required under §58D109(b) of the Makahat Act, which provides that all leaseback payments must be appropriated annually by I Liheslaturan Guåhan. Accordingly, no obligation shall arise unless and until the Legislature enacts the annual leaseback appropriations and the two additional construction appropriations, and the Government of Guam shall have no liability in the absence of such appropriations.
- 2. Project Cost: The primary construction is capped at \$166 million, as stipulated in the RFP and clarified in Addendum 1, consistent with the financing ceiling set forth under \$58D108 of the Makahat Act ("not to exceed \$166,365,000"). Any amounts proposed by CTI in excess of this statutory ceiling, including the 1% allocation for Arts in Public Buildings and Facilities, are not accepted and shall be adjusted by CTI to comply with this cap.
- 3. Programmatic Compliance: The school shall be designed and constructed consistent with the programmatic documents, including all wings, FF&E, and program elements identified in the RFP and Addendum 1. This requirement reflects DPW's August 15, 2025 letter and Addendum 1 responses confirming that all FF&E and all program elements must be delivered in the final project scope.
- 4. Leaseback Terms: The leaseback period shall commence upon completion of the project and acceptance by the Government of Guam, as required by §58D103(b) of the Makahat Act, which

authorizes leasebacks only after project completion and limits the leaseback period to no more than 30 years from that date. At the end of the lease period, title to the school and its furniture, fixtures and equipment transfer to the Government of Guam.

This acceptance is made in full compliance with the Makahat Act and the governing RFP, ensuring that the procurement process remains fair, transparent, and defensible.

We appreciate Core Tech International's cooperation in aligning its proposal with the Government of Guam's requirements, and we look forward to working together to deliver a modern, resilient school facility that will serve Guam's students and community for generations. The Government of Guam will be collaborating with you further to finalize the contractual documents, including the maintenance and insurance agreements.

- (i) School design shall mean the architectural and engineering design procured by GDOE in solicitation number RFP 006-2020 pursuant to Public Law 34-101 without a firing range.

§ 58D103. Authorization to Enter Into Long-Term Leases.

- (a) The GDOE is authorized to lease the school property to the Contractor for the purpose of facilitating the financing, construction, FF&E services, and maintenance of the new Simon Sanchez High School.
- Simon Sanchez High School for a period mutually agreed upon between the GDOE and the Contractor as may be reasonably necessary to amortize over the leaseback period the costs associated with the financing, construction, and FF&E services for the new Simon Sanchez High School as provided in this Act. In no event shall the end of such leaseback period be later than the date thirty (30) years from the scheduled date of completion of the new Simon Sanchez High School. The leaseback may be structured as an annually renewable lease with a provision for automatic renewal to the extent that pledged revenue under § 58D109 is available. The

leaseback shall not be construed as "public indebtedness," as that term is defined in

2 48 USC § 1423a, §11 of the Organic Act of Guam, or Guam law.

§ 58D104. Procurement.

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- 4 (a) Within ninety (90) days of the enactment of this Act, the GDOE, through the Department of Public Works (DPW), shall issue a solicitation in compliance with the Guam Procurement Law, for the following services with regard to the new Simon Sanchez High School: (1) financing; (2) construction; (3) FF&E services; and (4) insurance and maintenance. The services provided shall utilize and incorporate the school design.
- 10 (b) The determination of responsible offerors and responsive offers shall
 11 be made by an evaluation committee comprised of the Superintendent of the
 12 Department of Education, serving as the Chairman, and including the Director of
 13 Public Works or Deputy Director and the Building Permits Administrator; the
 14 Director of Land Management or Guam Chief Planner; the Administrator of the
 15 Guam Economic Development Authority or Deputy Administrator; and the Principal
 16 of Simon Sanchez High School or his/her designee.
 - (c) The Committee shall evaluate offerors and the offers received based on the requirements set forth in the solicitation.
- 19 (d) Upon completion of the committee's evaluation, the Superintendent 20 through the Department of Public Works shall issue the award in accordance with 21 the Guam Procurement Law.

§ 58D105. Responsibilities of Contractor.

The Contractor shall be responsible for all costs, expenses, and fees of any kind or nature, associated with civil improvements, on-site and off-site infrastructure, construction, demolition of the existing facility, permits, FF&E services, and financing associated with the completion of the new Simon Sanchez High School, consistent with the school design, as and to the extent provided in the

1 solicitation. The contractor shall also be responsible for maintenance of and insurance for the new Simon Sanchez High School during the leaseback period, but 2 3 shall not be responsible for maintenance of the furniture and equipment. The leaseback may provide that if sufficient funds are not appropriated or otherwise 4 5 available for the payment of amounts due under the lease and any maintenance agreement, the GDOE will have the obligation to vacate the new Simon Sanchez 6 7 High School, and the contractor shall have the right of use and occupancy of the new Simon Sanchez High School for the remainder of the term of the lease, unless the 8 9 parties to the contract enter into new mutually satisfactory terms. For this purpose, the lease may provide that its term shall be extended for a period not to exceed the 10 shorter of ten (10) years beyond the original term of the leaseback or such period of 11 time as is necessary to repay in full any financing arranged pursuant to § 58D108. 12

Furniture and equipment maintenance costs shall be paid by the GDOE on a periodic basis as incurred by the contractor on terms to be agreed to in the contract.

§ 58D106. Contractual Safeguards.

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The contract for the new Simon Sanchez High School shall provide for the construction of and FF&E services for the new Simon Sanchez High School in accordance with the Guam Building Code under Chapter 67 of Title 21, Guam Code Annotated, and any other applicable requirements. The contract shall contain contractual obligations typically found in government of Guam construction contracts, including, but not limited to, the following:

- (a) all major subcontracts shall be covered by a performance bond;
- (b) the government of Guam and financing entities, or bondholders, shall be the named obligee under the bond;
- (c) the government of Guam shall have the sole right to call on the bid bond;

- (d) requirements to obtain performance and or payment bonds, indemnification, standard insurance specifications, technical building/construction specifications, construction progress schedule, applicable and or necessary maintenance schedules, and compliance with applicable rules, regulations, and Guam law; and
- (e) there shall be a specific delivery date with liquidated damages for failure to deliver the new Simon Sanchez High School by the specified date, which may include warranties for liquidated damages.

§ 58D107. Assignments.

To facilitate the purposes of this Act and to provide security for the holders of any financing instruments issued pursuant to this Act, the Contractor may assign, with the consent of GDOE, the contract, the lease, and the leaseback to any underwriter, trustee; or other party as appropriate, to facilitate the issuance of the tax-exempt obligations, other financial instruments or alternative financing for the new Simon Sanchez High School.

§ 58D108. Financing.

To minimize the cost to the government of Guam, financing utilized by the Contractor to fund the construction of and FF&E services for the new Simon Sanchez High School shall be through tax-exempt obligations, or other financial instruments; provided, that such financing is available at an interest rate of no more than eight-and-a-half percent (8.5%). The contractor may use an alternative method of financing, including, but not limited to, a short-term debt, mortgage, loan, federally guaranteed loan, or loan by an instrumentality of the United States of America if such financing will better serve the needs of the people of Guam, subject to approval by I Liheslaturan Guahan. The principal amount of financing authorized under this Section shall not exceed One Hundred Sixty-six Million Three Hundred Sixty-five Thousand Dollars (\$166,365,000).

§ 58D109. Leaseback Payments Under the Lease Payable from Lawfully Available Monies.

- (a) Payments under the lease and the leaseback may be secured by a pledge or other reservation of revenues payable from any lawfully available monies of the government of Guam, and may be secured by a pledge or other reservation of such monies on an annual basis.
- (b) Any amounts pledged or reserved as provided in this Section and subsequently appropriated for the purpose of making leaseback payments may thereafter be pledged toward making leaseback payments; provided, however, that any amounts reserved as provided in this Section shall be subject to an annual appropriation by the Guam Legislature for the purpose of funding the activities set forth in § 58D104 of this Chapter, and making leaseback payments.
- (c) Any such pledge or reservation authorized hereunder shall be valid and binding from the time the pledge or reservation is made and shall be limited to the sum of Sixteen Million Three Hundred Seventy-seven Thousand One Hundred Twenty-five Dollars (\$16,377,125) per year during the pre-development, construction, and leaseback period. The revenues pledged or reserved and thereafter received by the government of Guam or by any trustee, depository or custodian shall be deposited in a separate account and shall be immediately subject to such reservation or the lien of such pledge without any physical delivery thereof or further act, and such reservation or the lien of such pledge shall be valid and binding against all parties having claims of any kind in tort, contract or otherwise against the government of Guam or such trustee, depository or custodian, irrespective of whether the parties have notice thereof. The instrument by which such a pledge or reservation is created need not be recorded.

§ 58D110. Utilities and Routine Maintenance and Repair.

The contractor shall be responsible for the connection of all utilities, including without limitation, power, water, sewer, telephone and cable, and all routine interior and exterior maintenance and repair, and exterior groundskeeping and landscaping, and upkeep of the new Simon Sanchez High School.

§ 58D111. Maintenance Fund.

The contract and the leaseback shall provide that all maintenance of the new Simon Sanchez High School not described in § 58D110 be performed by the Contractor as a separate cost, the terms of which, and the manner for establishing the amount of payment, shall be determined as a part of the contract; provided, however, that the contract may, at the discretion of the GDOE, provide that maintenance with respect to equipment (including collateral equipment), onsite utilities, offsite utilities, access roads and other similar improvements need not be performed by the Contractor.

§ 58D112. Severability. If any provision of this Act or its application to any person or circumstance is found to be invalid or inorganic, such invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of this Act that can be given effect without the invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions of this Act are severable."

Core Tech International Corporation (CTI) is pleased to submit this final proposal in response to your letter dated August 15, 2025, outlining the Government of Guam's requirements for the New Simon Sanchez High School project.

We fully acknowledge and understand the following project requirements:

- The facility must accommodate 2,000 students.
- The design must include 87 classrooms.
- All wings, including C Wing, must be constructed without omission.
- Construction must encompass all Furniture, Fixtures, and Equipment (FF&E).
- The total project cost, including FF&E and the 1% allocation for Arts in Public Buildings and Facilities under Public Law 20-27, may not exceed \$143 million.

We understand the \$143 million is subject to \$166 million bond principal cap. Splitting the funding sources into two — bond financing for 30 years and direct payment for two years during construction — will yield higher project funding while maintaining the \$166 million cap.

More specifically, based on the discussion with the underwriter Barclays, 30 years of financing may yield \$133.3 net to the project (construction, FF&E, and arts), subject to assumptions believed to be reasonable but not guaranteed. It will be augmented by two appropriations in FYs 2026 and 2027 of a combined \$32.8M (which CTI believes to be permissible under the public law), thereby totaling \$166.1M.

Based on the financial stacking as mentioned above, it will yield the available funding for the project \$166.1M yet the required \$167,660,000, so there is a shortage of \$1,560,000. However, CTI is committed to meeting the budget.

CTI remains fully committed to delivering this project within budget and on schedule. We look forward to continuing our partnership with the Government of Guam to fulfill its critical educational infrastructure goals and to serve the Simon Sanchez High School community.

The latest response from CTI seems like we're back to meeting #2 or #3 where they are removing the entire C wing. Again, this wing is made up of 20 classrooms - at least half of them are specialized classrooms and labs that are not easily shared with other teachers. As I was crafting this, Mr. Ho sends an updated email with Additive 1" Building C Construction with 2026 appropriation and Additive 2 with FFE with 2027 appropriation.

What if "base bid" stays intact as originally defined (all the wings, etc.) and Additive 1 & 2 be the special scope items outside of the base bid. Lester reminded us a few meetings ago about "base bid" items and special scope items such as auditorium, multi-purpose field, Photovoltaic cells, etc. I am sure we can identify \$16 million special scope items instead of just identifying C-wing as the first choice.

In summary, keep base bid items for the \$143 and do the special scope items for Additives 1 and 2.
